Malaspina Choir was founded in 1970. Its role in Nanaimo's civic and ceremonial life began with the opening of Malaspina College (now VIU) and a performance for Queen Elizabeth in 1983. To encourage younger musicians, we invited local school and college ensembles to celebrate Canada's 150th anniversary and were awarded a Canada Heritage grant for this initiative. Over the years, the choir has produced the masterworks of celebrated composers, including Handel, Brahms and Bernstein, as well as 21st century repertoire. Since 2021, we have produced four seasons including such concerts as: Mozart's Requiem; Vivaldi's Gloria; two iconic Sing-Along Messiahs; and Jubilation, a gala concert to celebrate Malaspina Choir's 50-plus years. We were featured guests at the Vancouver Island Symphony's sold-out Carmen & Mamma Mia concert in 2023. Highlights from last fall were: a thrilling presentation of Karl Jenkin's The Armed Man with over 60 singers and 11 players; plus, two productions of A Child's Christmas in Wales, with celebrated actor Adrian Hough playing the Welsh poet Dylan Thomas. 
